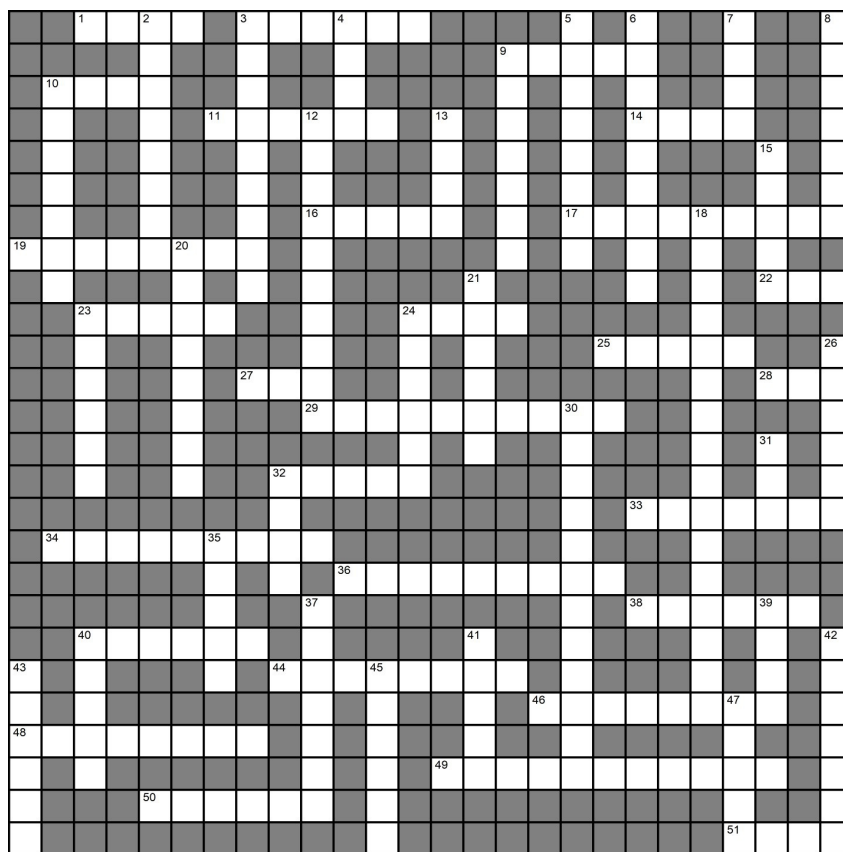


# A Crossword Puzzle of Classic Riddles
