

Mosquito-borne Dengue Fever Outbreak in Bangladesh

42,590 cases, 117 deaths

One Million Rohingya Refugees at Risk

Urgent Need for Chemically-treated Mosquito Nets

1558 daily admissions—a record high
All hospitals are overwhelmed
Expected to increase this month



Dengue fever, a potentially fatal disease transmitted by mosquitoes, has become epidemic in Bangladesh. In Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh, more than one million Rohingya Muslims are cramped together in the world's largest refugee camp. The squalid and unsanitary conditions in the camp are a breeding ground for mosquitoes. Nets provide protection not only for sleeping, but for stationary daytime activities. One net costs about \$3.25. \$100 provides protection for 30 families. Let us work together to support and protect these refugees who have fled from genocide perpetrated by the Myanmar military and the Arakan Army and perpetual and brutal harassment by many of the Buddhists in the country that has been their home for centuries.



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
